God Sent His Son, Jesus

“A Savior has been born.”

Luke 2:11

When your family sits down to share God’s Word, use this devotion on its own or go to <https://davidccook.org/echoes/resources> to watch **God Sent His Son, Jesus** before doing the devotion together. This devotion works well in December.

In the video, the kids name ways to let people know that Jesus is born—by making Christmas cards, giving gifts, by singing and dancing. There are many ways to share the wonderful news of Christ’s birth, especially in this season.

- How can you let people know that Jesus is born?

The Bible tells us that Jesus is our Savior. He came to earth as a baby so that He could one day give His own life to pay for our sins. We all sin, and we all need Jesus as our Savior. His death on the cross paid the price for our sins so that we can be forgiven and live with God in heaven forever.

- Why would Jesus give His life for us?
- Memorize Luke 2:11 together. How do you feel knowing Jesus is your Savior?
- How can your family let others know that Jesus is their Savior too?

End with a short prayer: Dear God, thank You for sending Jesus to be born as our Savior. This Christmas season, help us to remember and celebrate the greatest gift ever given—the gift of Your Son. In Jesus’ name, amen.

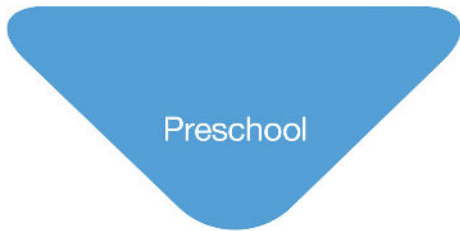

- What are some of your favorite things to touch, see, smell, hear, and taste?
- What are some things you don't like to touch, see, smell, hear, and taste?

God made us and He knows us. He loves us just the way we are. Each one of us is His special creation, and He has given us unique gifts and talents that help make us who we are.

- Memorize Psalm 100:3 together.
- What are some of the gifts or talents God has given each person in your family?
- How can your family use the gifts God has given you to show His love to others?

End with a short prayer: Dear God, thank You for each person in our family. Thank You for making us just the way we are. Help us to use our gifts and talents to serve and honor You. In Jesus' name, amen.



Unit 18

We Worship God Together

Worship the LORD.
Psalm 96:9

When your family sits down to share God's Word, use this devotion on its own or go to <https://davidccook.org/echoes/resources> to watch **We Worship God Together** before doing the devotion together. This devotion works well in February.

Webster's dictionary defines *worship* as "to regard with great or extravagant respect, honor, or devotion." One of the kids in the video says, "Worship is how we tell God we love Him." Talk with your family about what it means to worship.

- What are some ways you can worship God?

We can worship God even when we're not at church. As a matter of fact, we can worship God through everyday things such as being kind to others, singing, praying, and giving.

- Memorize Psalm 96:9 together.
- What is your favorite way to worship? What questions do you have about worship?
- Learning about God is one way to worship. Who teaches you more about God?

End with a short prayer: Dear God, thank You that we can worship You anytime and anywhere. Thank You for hearing and seeing our worship. Help us to never stop learning about You. In Jesus' name, amen.
