When they don't have the resources to respond in a way that shows God's love, they do whatever their upbringing or reflexes tell them!

So this Fall, let's decide to all get on the same bus. This first level of “basic training” is something we all need, even seasoned vets. It renews our passion and refocuses us on what's important.

Jesus. Kids. Showing God's love in ways that have meaning for the kids you teach.
